SHORT TRACKERS GO FOR THE GOLD
The pursuit of "Olympic Gold" has long been the dream of short track speedskaters. Eight young men and women are one step closer to realizing the dream as they prepare to represent the United States in Calgary. Short Track Speedskating has been included in the Olympic program for the very first time, as a demonstration event.

The competition should prove to be intense as the top skaters from the top five teams in the world go for gold. The United States team, Tricia Stennes, Becky Mane Sanfelippo, Tara Lazlo, Amy Peterson, Patrick Moore, Andy Gabel, Brian Arseneau, and David Besteman will go head to head with teams from Canada, Japan, Holland and Italy before a standing room only crowd. This venue has been sold out for months.

The U.S. Team has been training together in Lake Placid since the beginning of January in preparation for not only the Olympics but for the World Short Track Championships. The World Championships will be held in Saint Louis, Missouri, February 9 - 11. This competition will be a preview of the upcoming Olympic event.

"Our team is strong" says U.S. Coach Pat Maxwell. "They know the competition is going to be tough and they're ready to go all out". Becky Mane Sanfelippo, Milwuakee, Wisconsin, brings the most world class experience to the women's team. Sanfelippo has competed in the World Short Track Championships every year since 1984. Tara Lazlo, St. Paul, Minnesota, competed in the World Championships in both 1986 and 1987. Lazlo also competed in World Cup meets (longtrack) in 1987. Amy Peterson and Tricia Stennes competed in their first World Short Track Championship in 1987 , in which both skated with exceptional poise and determination.

The men's team is considered by many to be exceptionaliy strong. Patrick Moore, Niles, Illinois has been a World Team Member six times. David Besteman, Madison, Wisconsin has been a World Team Member in three previous championships. Brian Arseneau, Arlington Heights, Illinois competed in the World Short Track Championships in both 1986 and 1987. Andy Gabel, Northbrook, Illinois competed in his first World Championship in 1987.

The men's teams have consistently done well in the 5000 M Relay event. At the 1987 World Championships the relay was especially dramatic. With 35 laps left in the 5000 M event Brian Arseneau injured his ankle and was unable to finish. Without missing a beat

Patrick Moore immediately took the tag from Arseneau and continued the race. In third place, the U.S. Team now had to finish the race with three skaters to the other teams' four skaters. Moore, Gabel and Besteman dug in and held on to their third place, bringing home the bronze medal.

Under the guidance of coach Pat Maxwell this 1988 Short Track Team looks forward to the exciting challenge ahead at the World Short Track Championships and Winter Olympic Games. They can be proud of their outstanding accomplishments as they forge the way for future Short Track Speedskating Olympians in the pursuit of olympic gold.

## WORLD SHORT TRACK SPEEDSKATING

Short Track style speedskating consists of four to six skaters competing at the same time on a 111.12 meter oval track. All skaters compete in qualifying heats and semi-finals to skate in the final race where they are awarded points to determine the winners. There are no age divisions.

Distances skated for Men and Women: 500, 1000, 1500, and 3000 meters. Points scored: 1 st-5 points; $2 n d-3$ points; 3rd-2 points; 4 th-1 point.

While World competitors on an outdoor 400 meter track have been traditional and almost exclusively so in Europe, an attempt to promote World Indoor competition on a "short" track was initiated at Champaign, Illinois in 1976 under the impetus of Mr. Bill Markland of Champaign. Nine nations participated in this fledging endeavor to establish a World "Short Track" Championship.

Since then more nations have been added to the list of participants. As of 1980 the International Skating Union has officially recognized World Indoor (Short Track) Championships. The addition of short track speedskating as a demonstration event in Calgary brings it one step closer to recognition by the International Olympic Committee as an official part of the Olympic program.
