
Reflections on a

IN 1960 I compete in the Squaw Valley Olympic Winter Games as a speed skater. This was a significant experience for me— I was only sixteen years old and competing with the best athletes in the world. Two years later I was attending the College of Arts and Sciences, where the discipline, focus, and perseverance I acquired through my Olympic training helped me to continue in my studies after a tragic car accident. Every day for weeks while I was receiving physical therapy at Sargent College, members of the faculty would come and sit by my bedside, reviewing class lectures that I had missed. The faculty at BU pushed me to achieve my goals and enabled me to flourish as a student. Only at BU will you find this kind of dedication to the education of its students. BU is a wonderful center for learning and growth. I grew here, and it was a special place to me and so many others.

I LOVE BU, and for this reason I have decided to bequeath a piece of artwork and history to Boston University. While I was attending the 1980 Winter Games in Lake Placid, I purchased an original Leroy Neiman print featuring Eric Heiden, Olympic gold medal-winning speed skater, and BU alums from the "Miracle on Ice" men's hockey team. What a triumphant victory for BU and the United States when we won the gold medal. I hope this gift will inspire others to consider supporting Boston University with an estate gift.
