land, he flew an early morning D-Day mission. He was shot down over Mayenne, France, on June 16, 1944, and hidden by the French Underground for 65 days. He was freed when Patton's Third Army encircled the area. His experience with the French Underground is included in two books, "Agents For Escape" by Andre Rougeyron and "7xXx90: The Story of a Stirling Bomber and Its Crew" by Charles Potten.

He was discharged from military service and married Eunice Waite on July 21, 1946, in St. Peter's Church, Saratoga Springs. Len worked for the New York Telephone Co. for 35 years, retiring in 1981. He remained active in numerous Air Force organizations, includ-ing the P-47 Thunderbolt Pilots' Association, the Air Force Escape and Evasion Society and the 405th Fighter Group. He and Eunice traveled the world in order to attend yearly reunions.

Len was a member of the Saratoga Winter Club and was a speedskating champion during the 1930s. He coached the Saratoga Winter Club during the 1950s and early 1960s. He was a former member of the National Ski Patrol, skiing at Alpine Meadows for most of his adult life. An avid sportsman, in addition to skiing and skating, he enjoyed running, cross-country skiing and roller blading at the Spa State Park. An excellent golfer, he was a past member of Links McGregor Brookhaven Golf Course.

He was a communicant of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Ballston Spa.

He will always be remembered as a wonderful husband, father and grandfather and an enthusiastic and graceful athlete and for his unique sense of style, wit and human

wit and humor.

He was predeceased by his loving wife, Eunice Waite Schallehn; three brothers, Theodore, John and Eugene Schallehn; and a sister, Berenice Kirkpatrick.

Survivors include his two daughters, Cynthia Bouyea and Sandra Neal; two granddaughters, Kelly Collins Fitts and Emily Sprague; a brother, Robert Schallehn; a sister-inlaw, Irene Schallehn; several nieces and nephews; his loyal friend, Kevin Sprague; and his Wesley family of nurses and staff on Hawthorne 2.
